THE FIRST LESSON: Acts 11:19-26

19 Now those who had been scattered by the persecution in connection with Stephen traveled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus and Antioch, telling the message only to Jews. 20 Some of them, however, men from Cyprus and Cyrene, went to Antioch and began to speak to Greeks also, telling them the good news about the Lord Jesus. 21 The Lord's hand was with them, and a great number of people believed and turned to the Lord. 22 News of this reached the ears of the church at Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. 23 When he arrived and saw the evidence of the grace of God, he was glad and encouraged them all to remain true to the Lord with all their hearts.

24 He was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and faith, and a great number of people were brought to the Lord. 25 Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, 26 and when he found him, he brought him to Antioch. So for a whole year Barnabas and Saul met with the church and taught great numbers of people. The disciples were called Christians first at Antioch.

RESPONSIVE READING

<u>Pastor</u>: Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. "Honor your father and mother"—which is the first commandment with a promise...

CONGREGATION: ...that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth."

<u>Pastor</u>: A wise son brings joy to his father, but a foolish son grief to his mother.

CONGREGATION: Discipline your son, for in that there is hope; do not be a willing party to his death.

<u>Pastor</u>: Listen to your father, who gave you life, and do not despise your mother when she is old.

CONGREGATION: May your father and mother be glad; may she who gave you birth rejoice!

Pastor: A wife of noble character who can find? She is worth far more

than rubies.

CONGREGATION: Her children arise and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her.

Pastor: Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting.

CONGREGATION: But a woman who fears the Lord is to be praised.

<u>Pastor/CONGREGATION</u>: Children's children are a crown to the aged, and parents are the pride of their children.

THE SECOND LESSON: 1 John 4:1-11

1 Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world. 2 This is how you can recognize the Spirit of God: Every spirit that acknowledges that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God, 3 but every spirit that does not acknowledge Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the antichrist, which you have heard is coming and even now is already in the world. 4 You, dear children, are from God and have overcome them, because the one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world. 5 They are from the world and therefore speak from the viewpoint of the world, and the world listens to them. 6 We are from God, and whoever knows God listens to us; but whoever is not from God does not listen to us. This is how we recognize the Spirit

of truth and the spirit of falsehood. 7 Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. 8 Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. 9 This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. 10 This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. 11 Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.

THE VERSE

<u>Pastor</u>: Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed. Alleluia!

Congregation: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! These words are written that we may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

9 "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. 10 If you obey my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have obeyed my Father's commands and remain in his love. 11 I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. 12 My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. 13 Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends. 14 You are my friends if you do what I command. 15 I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my
